

Clase de español Country Project

Country reports must include:

Geographic location: Is it on the coastline? Mountains? Desert? Tropical? What's the weather like?

People: Population? Do most of the people live in the city or country? What do people do for jobs?

Holidays: (Include at least two) How do they celebrate?

Food: What are the main crops there and what do people eat?

Clothing: How do they dress? Do you know why they dress that way?

Education: Does the government offer a free public education? Do the students wear uniforms? What are the schools like? What percentage of the people are educated?

Recreation: What do the people do for fun?

Interesting facts: Include three interesting things that make your country unique.

Sources: Use at least one book and at least two internet sources.

Your paper should include one paragraph for each of the above subjects. This paper will be turned in the day you give your presentation. You will also do a 4-5 minute presentation to the class. Please do not read your report to the class for your presentation. You can have index cards to help you remember what you want to say if you need them. (Your poster or PowerPoint will be useful to help you present your information to the class.) You don't need to present all of what you research. Make it interesting and fun for the class.

Your report should also include either a poster or pictures of the country using PowerPoint or something similar. You are welcome to bring in items from the country if you have access to them. You can also bring in food samples for the class to try.

Presentations will begin Tuesday, February 3. We will do a few each class period until all have presented. If you are unprepared for the day you are to report, 15 points will be automatically deducted from your grade. 75 possible points: 35 points for your written report, 20 points for the poster/power point and 20 points for your presentation.
